

***MEET ME IN SUNCOOK!***  
**Minutes of Meeting**  
**September 7, 2010**

Present: Marie Ayles, Noreen Bean, Joyce Belanger, Gerry Belanger, Jocelyn Carlucci, Norma Daviault, Ron Daviault, James Garvin, Vincent Greco, Roger Menard, Larry Perron.

1. Chair Jocelyn Carlucci called the meeting to order at the old Pembroke Fire and Police Station at 7:05 p.m.
2. On a motion by Ron Daviault, seconded by Roger Menard, the minutes of the meeting of August 3, 2010, were unanimously approved with one correction: Peter Provencher's wife is co-president of the Pembroke Women's Club, not the Pembroke Lion's Club.
3. Noreen Bean delivered the treasurer's report, as follows:

4. On a motion by Doc Greco, seconded by Ron Daviault, the treasurer's report was unanimously approved as presented.
5. Jocelyn Carlucci passed a bill from Ballard's Novelty and Party Shop to Noreen for payment.
6. Roger Menard reported no sales of minutes on the town clock.
7. Jocelyn provided an update on Ingrid and Regis Lemaire from a conversation of today. Both are doing well; Regis is walking up to five miles. Their apartment building is being sold, but they hope to be able to remain in their apartment after the sale.
8. Jim Garvin described the project to survey, evaluate, and possibly remove the Buck Street Dam[s]. Joyce McKay had suggested that *Meet Me in Suncook* might like to apply to be a "consulting party" under federal law. Consulting party status is granted by the lead federal agency in any federally-funded or -permitted project that affects a National Register-eligible property. If the Buck Street dams and bridges are found to be eligible for the Register following evaluation, then potentially interested parties may apply to be consulting parties, thereby receiving all information on a project. On a motion by Dr. Vincent Greco, seconded by Gerald Belanger, the committee voted unanimously to seek consulting part status if the Buck Street dams and bridges are found to be eligible for the National Register and if the proposed project proceeds to the point of seeking federal permits.
9. There was no update on work on the contents of the vault.

10. Jocelyn reported that Sally Breslin of the *Hooksett Banner* called in search of photographs of the Suncook area and was offered a number of 35mm. slides taken by Ingrid, and color prints of the town clock building showing people working on the roof. Ingrid sent Jocelyn and article from Las Vegas regarding the City of Berlin, N. H., and its weekly bus tour of historic sites as a comparison with the *Meet Me in Suncook* bus tour.
11. On a motion by Joyce Belanger, seconded by Noreen Bean, the committee unanimously agreed to reimburse Roger Menard for his expenses for costume rental for the Old Home Day float.
12. Jocelyn showed the committee a large color print, approximately 24" by 36", of Suncook Village together with a frame for the print. She suggested that the framed print be hung on the wall of our meeting room. The photograph costs \$20 and the frame costs \$11. On a motion by Ron Daviault, seconded by Jim Garvin, the committee unanimously voted to pay the costs of picture and frame and place them in the meeting room with a label, "Provided by *Meet Me in Suncook*," to show users of the room that *MMIS* donated the image. Noreen Bean was authorized to make a check payable to the Old Home Day Committee, which offers the picture and frame.
13. Jocelyn showed the committee photographs of the Old Home Day parade and the Allenstown-Suncook float, and thanked everyone, especially Doc Greco and Carl Manseau, for their contributions of time, effort, trailer, and everything that was invested in creating the float. The float won first place for "theme," and would have won first place for "originality" if a single entry were permitted to be awarded two "firsts." Brent Michael took a set of photographs and Larry Perron collected a second set. On a motion by Roger Menard, seconded by Ron Daviault, the committee unanimously agreed to place the First Place award in the collections of the Allenstown Historical Society in recognition of their investment of time, work, and artistic skill.
14. Joyce Belanger reported that Norma and Ron Daviault went to the Veterans' Cemetery in Boscawen to look at granite benches with backs, etc. The committee agreed that now that we are past Old Home Day, we should approach the Pembroke Board of Selectmen with a formal written proposal to place a bench on the town-owned lot on Buck Street, bordering the Suncook River. Joyce and Gerry Belanger suggested that we make up six or seven packets describing Robert Frost and explaining why we are suggesting this use of the lot. The packet should describe the parcel of land and provide a plan showing its location, and illustrate a granite bench. We should emphasize that this proposal will be at no cost to the town, and that the parcel will remain town land. Gerry and Jocelyn agreed to work on a draft proposal. Jim Garvin will update Mrs. J. Willcox Brown on the project with the thought that she might be interested in making a donation.
15. Gerry Belanger showed the committee 1912 Sanborn Fire Insurance Maps of Suncook Village. On a motion by Doc Greco, seconded by Larry Perron, the committee agreed to offer the maps to the Suncook Water Works. *Meet Me in Suncook* will accept the maps if the Water Works does not wish to accept them.
16. The next meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, October 5, 2010, at 7:00 p.m. at the Old Pembroke Fire and Police Station.
17. On a motion by Doc Greco, seconded by Roger Menard, the meeting adjourned at 8:17 p.m.
