Pembroke Police investigate daytime burglary

The Pembroke Police Department responded to an attempted burglary in the 400 block of Cross Country Road this morning at 10:47 am, after a resident of the home saw a man trying to break in. The home owner called police after being woken by banging at the rear of the home. In looking out the rear the resident saw a white male, approximately 40 years old, 5'10" tall, wavy, dark colored hair, stocky build, wearing a black sweat shirt in the back yard. The resident saw the suspect walk into the woods behind the residence. They called 911. While waiting for the police to arrive the resident hid in an upstairs closet. The perpetrator returned. He threw a rock through a rear window setting off the burglar alarm. The suspect fled at that point. The Pembroke Police arrived at 10:51 am. The NH State Police Responded with a K-9 unit. The K-9 followed a tracked away from the home to a nearby roadway where the trail was lost. The Epsom Police Department, Chichester Police Department, and the Merrimack County Sheriff's Office assisted in searching the area.
