### B. Tennis Courts/lessons

Dave Doherty will run our tennis lessons. Rose will be in contact with Dave to set up dates.

Rose had Vermont Tennis look at 2 courts where some cracks have appeared. They stopped by to examine the courts and said all the membrane repairs are still intact and holding up. However, cracks will continue to grow which they have no control over. This is telling them that the courts are moving yearly. He is willing to stop by when he is in the area to address the hairline cracks. Cost \$385 Karyn made a motion to have them address the cracks. Chris seconded. Motion passed Rose will let the school know when they are coming so they can go over the repair process. This would allow the school maintenance to keep an eye on this and fill them as needed.
