**OLD BUSINESS**

A. Approval of Minutes (June) and financials

C. Concerts – Last concert was well attended (around 70).

Rob will get names and addresses of performers and give them to Rose so checks can be processed. He will pick up checks and the week of the concert and give to the performers.

D. Tennis Courts - Weather dependent - Prep work will begin August 2. Work on the courts will begin on August 10

- E. Spica Toy - The company will give us a 15% discount on the part. Jade Stone is going to field on July 19 to give us an estimate to install. Rose will forward to Rick the plans for the repair before we make a decision to purchase.
- F. CIP 5 year plan - Hold - Since two members were absent commission decided to wait until the next meeting to place items on updated 5 year sheet.
