2021 Annual Director's Report

2021 Financial Summary:

- Revenue from **AMBULANCE BILLINGS** was less than budget. (-\$31,523.94) This is attributed to a less than expected Transport Volume. Tri-Town EMS expects to receive, on average of \$539.35 per transport. 2020 transport volume factors into the revenues for 2021. 2020 had approximately 80 less transports than projected and 2021 was approximately 30 less transports than projected.
- **PER DIEM SALARIES** had a remaining balance of \$50,626.05. This was due to the lack of Per Diem Paramedics picking up open Full Time Paramedic shifts. These shifts were covered with Full Time Employees in Overtime or by the EMS Director. Also, the Service budgeted for and did not utilize On-Call Staff.
- **OVERTIME** was overspent by (\$9,739.62). As stated, this was mostly due to Full Time Paramedics working open Full-Time shifts. Should be noted that one (1) Full Time Employee was out on a Leave of Absence in the beginning of the year.
- **HEALTH INSURANCE** had a remaining balance of \$9,749.00. The cost of Health Insurance for our Full Time Staff was less than anticipated.
- **TRAINING & CERTIFICATION** had a remaining balance of \$14,061.03. The Service had budget concerns late summer and early fall. Therefore, the planned purchase of a new training mannequin was put off.
- VEHICLE MAINTENANCE & REPAIR was overspent by (\$6,615.04). In addition to routine maintenance on the ambulances, the Service had to repair the driver's side mirror, perform exhaust system repairs, and replace the tires all on Ambulance 8. These three (3) repairs total up to \$8,738.37
- **COMPUTER / SOFTWARE MAINTENANCE** was overspent by (\$7,696.99). The Service had some IT issues that needed to be solved. The Service also replaced the EMS Director's Computer that was seven (7) years old and a SurfacePRO Tablet used by EMS crews to write run reports.


