Monthly Director's Report September 2020

September 2020 in SUMMARY

- Ambulance 3 & Ambulance 8 received annual Safety Inspection and maintenance
- Full Time vacancy was filled with employee going through orientation and is now staffing the ambulance.
- Work continued on the Policy Manual.
- NCCP Trainings (Monthly Trainings) resumed.

- New Hampshire EMS Patient Care Protocol, Version 8

STAFFING & RECRUITMENT

The Service moved forward with hiring a Full Time Paramedic to fill the vacancy. The new employee started in September and completed his orientation and was scheduled shifts.

At the beginning of September, there were three application for employment, two (2) are EMT's and one (1) is a paramedic. Currently the roster is relatively full at 29 employees. One of the EMT's withdrew and the other two (2) applicants are in different stages of the interviewing process.

Per Diem staff were made aware of new availability requirements. Per Diem staff are required to put in availability for one (1) weekend shift per month and must put in for shifts that are actually vacant. The Deputy Director will send out the shifts that are available for Per Diem employees each month.

POLICIES

Work continued on the Policy Manual. The manual combines all previously adopted policies with recommended additions. It will be divided into 5 sections:

- 1. Definitions
- 2. Administrative Policies
- 3. Operational Policies
- 4. Training and Clinical Policies
- 5. Infection Control Policies

TRAININGS

On September 16th, the Service resumed hosting monthly NCCP trainings at the Pembroke Public Safety Center. These trainings, in addition to the monthly article and other on shift trainings are intended to meet the educational requirements needed for all license levels to re-license every two (2) years.

MEDICAL RESOURCE HOSPITAL AGREEMENT (MRH)

The Service's Medical Resource Hospital, Concord Hospital sent out the latest MRH agreement. Other EMS services in the Capital Area had some concerns over the section pertaining to corrective action for deviation in care standards. The signing of the MRH was put on hold until these issues are resolved.



NEW HAMPSHIRE PATIENT CARE PROTOCOLS version 8

With virtually all employees having completed version 8 of the New Hampshire Patient Care Protocols, the Service is now operating under the new protocols. Protocol books were ordered for all staff and to be placed in the office and ambulances. In the next few week, electronic versions will be placed on Service computers, tables and phones.

CLINICAL & QUALITY ASSURANCE (QA)

- Each full time employee is responsible for reviewing the calls from the previous shift and entering the findings on the QA Log.
- Process is to ensure compliance with State EMS protocols and Service standards.
- Once the new full time employee has been oriented to their position, the QA responsibilities will be reassigned.
